#### Revd's Reflections

#### Vicar's Letter

Have you recently looked through a magnifying glass? A couple of years ago I took my grandson to an activity centre for pond dipping. It was a grey day and very chilly but interesting. The 'grown-ups' got completely involved in the exercise and became as excited as the children in what they were able to find.

My first attempt at dragging the net through the water appeared to have brought up nothing but weed, but after focussing my eyes I could see small creatures wriggling in the water. My grandson and I identified all we could see and were then invited to place the insects in a special viewing container which magnified everything even further.

It was really incredible to see the captured insects so clearly, but even more amazing was the sight of hundreds (literally) of tiny microscopic water fleas and minute beetles that had not been visible to the naked eye (well not mine anyway!). It was fascinating to see such abundance in a very small amount of water - even more astonishing was the fact that under a more powerful magnifier we could have seen even more!

This experience gave me a different outlook and respect for the hidden world around me in a way that I had not done before. Even walking back to the car (just missing the rain!) I was absorbed in reflecting on what was being trod underfoot in the puddles!

I have always admired God's handiwork – the cleverness of season, harmony and new life, but how much more I wonder still remains to be noticed and praised!

My attention has been drawn to the book of Isaiah (chapter 40 v12) The Lord asks us to consider his handiwork - 'Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance?'

Rain or shine, the earth trembles with life, and we are the most precious of his creation. He has placed us in a most amazing world yet sometimes we are unable to see what is literally beneath our feet! As we, along with so many in our world, witness scenes of cruelty and destruction, see the devastation that famine, illness and drought brings, it's a struggle and great sadness to witness so much evil co-existing with life-giving beauty.

Let us be reminded that God desires so much more for us than what we see at the moment.

We can be harbingers of hope – believing that God has not withdrawn from our world but is very much part of our lives and evident in those willing to see with his eyes and work for the transformed vision of others!

#### **CHANGES TO THE RIVER LARK**

#### **COUNCIL TAX REBATE GRANT**

The Government scheme is being administrated locally by West Suffolk Council. A grant of £150 is available to those on band A-D properties to help towards the increased costs in energy bills. Households who pay their Council Tax by Direct Debit will have the grant paid to them automatically. Households that do not pay by Direct Debit need to complete a simple online form:

If households do not apply before 31<sup>st</sup> May 2022, any eligible households will have the rebate grant applied to their Council Tax bill to reduce payments for the rest of the year

#### CAR BOOT SALES on BARTON MILLS PLAYING FIELD

Car Boot Sales are held on Barton Mills Playing Field, next to the Village Hall, on the mornings of Bank Holiday Mondays. Many people ask how they started, and why they only happen on these days. Many years ago, the W.I. held boot sales on the field, and the church combined a car boot sale with their summer fete. The playing field is owned and maintained by the Parish Council, and it was soon realised that it would be better to have a regular system for groups who wanted to hold boot sales. Because the field is a valuable area for everyone to use and enjoy the space, it was agreed that sales should only be held on Bank Holiday Mondays, and thus avoid upsetting football games and the free use of the field, especially at weekends.

There are five Barton Mills groups who are involved in the boot sales – the Village Hall committee, the W.I. the church, the Allotments Association and the Football Club. There are four available Mondays – Easter, May Day, Spring Bank Holiday and late Summer Bank Holiday, so a sharing system was devised. Each group provided the people to organise the field and/or to provide refreshments in the Village Hall. These days, the refreshments are provided by the Village Hall committee, the W.I, and the church, while the field is mostly organised by the Allotments Association and the Football Club. Each group raises money for their own funds, but the group on the field usually take a bucket collection at the exit, as well as taking the pitch fees, and the bucket collection is often for another charity. This year the Allotments Association have supported the Ukrainian Relief Fund and have given to allotmenteer Karen Farrar who has done the Moonwalk in London for Breast Cancer research.



#### Nature Notes.....

**Hedgehogs** – are in serious decline. Are you fortunate in having a regular or occasional one or two visiting your garden? Their diet includes slugs, cockchafers, weevils, dung beetles, earwigs, millipedes and earthworms. They probably need about a hundred of this assortment per night

but if they find carrion such as a dead bird or small mammal they'll have a feast. They are very much the gardener's friend and they can be greatly helped by providing a shallow dish of water, especially in dry weather, and providing a little wet-type cat or dog food, or dampen the dry sort. Put the food out after dark. If there is a likelihood of a cat cashing in on an extra feed, devise a covering which a hedgehog can enter but a cat couldn't. Another big help is to contribute to a hedgehog highway so they can travel from garden to garden. A hole in a fence need only be 13cm x 13 cm for an adult to pass through. In a radio-tracking study some were known to travel 1-2 miles in a night — but that would depend upon the habitat and availability of food items.

Most hedgehogs are born in June and July, in a nest made of grass and leaves. If the mother is disturbed within a few hours of giving birth she is likely to desert or eat the babies. At birth the spines are covered in skin and lead like likely lik


